Grace and Peace Beloved of God,

As Christians, we can celebrate, for each day is made by God. We can rejoice too, for Jesus Christ is Risen! And because Jesus lives, He holds the future, and we need not worry about tomorrow. Yet, people are anxious. There are too many clashes in culture, environmental disasters, and people using violent acts to harm one another. Understanding God's assurance and believing in His grace and mercy are especially needed now.

In the Gospel of Luke, there is an account of Jesus meeting two disciples as they walked to Emmaus. In the case of these disciples, they had lost hope. The loss of hope stemmed from the crucifixion of Jesus. (Luke 24:13-35) The two were devastated and embodied grief, anxiety, and despair. They believed that there no longer was hope. The two embodied the disbelief that too many people endure today.

In Jesus, hope is alive! Jesus leads people to find hope again. With the two disciples, Jesus modeled finding hope again so that we may understand that Jesus always draws near to each of us and intercedes on our behalf. (Romans 8:34) Jesus died for us so that we may live. He keeps His promise never to leave us. On the road to Emmaus, Jesus revealed that God is speaking through the Scriptures. Our Savior is so loving that He left the Holy Spirit as our comforter and guide that in studying the Scriptures, our hearts can experience new hope!

Because He lives, humankind is reconciled to God. Because He lives, we have peace with God. Because He lives, we also may boast in the hope of God's glory, even in our suffering. In the letter to the Romans, chapter 5, it is written that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not

put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. (Romans 5:1-5)

Be of good cheer. I pray your hearts are experiencing new hope, even now. Lean on God so that He equips you to be Christ's church in a world groping for peace and healing. Tell family, friends, and strangers that the Lord God is good, and His mercy for us endures forever. As we celebrate that Jesus has risen, invite those you meet to rise together in Christ's name at Dryland.


