Grace and Peace to you Beloved of God,

May this letter find you encouraged in the joy of the Gospel. I share with you wisdom from Proverbs. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to God, and your paths will be made straight. (Proverbs 3:5-6) We can trust in God, who loves humankind more than we can comprehend. God looks beyond our shortcomings, beyond our stubbornness, and takes on all our sins, shame, and rejection.

We have a friend in Jesus, who intercedes on our behalf so that we may be presented spotless before God and reconciled with God. The disciples endured uncertainty, ridicule, and threats of violence before they came to realize that all Jesus had taught them had come to pass. With joy, we can understand the Good News of Christ's Resurrection and our deliverance through new life in Christ Jesus. That is the joy with which the disciples went out shouting 'He is Risen, Christ Jesus has arisen from the dead!'

People across the world who have heard and accepted the Good News of salvation through Christ, experience peace and assurance, even during these uncertain times. This makes me think of wisdom shared by the Apostle Paul. He describes the disciples of Christ as ambassadors. In 2 Corinthians 5:20, Paul shares that our role as ambassadors for Christ includes representing God's message of reconciliation and urging others to be reconciled to Him. This is critical in a world with so much of the language and acts that glorify violence.

We are reminded not to use the ways of violence with words, policies, guns, and bombs. Instead, our path is that of prayer, belief, and acts of mercy. We are reminded that the battle is not ours and to trust that God will not only provide but will also transform our hearts and equip us to be victorious through our trials. As Jesus demonstrated victory over death, we too have victory and the assurance of eternal life with God.

Though violence was all around Jesus, even done to Jesus, and people of that age rejected God, God did not respond with wrath toward humankind. Instead of hating the world, God loved the world. God so loves the world that He gave His Son, Jesus. Jesus did not come to carry out the Father's wrath but came to love and reconcile the world. (John 3:16-18)

God knows that peace and love of neighbor start with you and me. It begins in our hearts and prayers. Love flows through our words and acts of compassion and care.

Through Christ, the world can be made anew, where people in need can be nurtured and restored. Yes, we can celebrate as Easter people, for through Christ all things are made new! I pray that we find joy in belonging to God. I pray that we glorify God and strive together in the unity of the Holy Spirit to become the church Christ is calling us to be.
