Grace and Peace Beloveds,

A year ago, around this time, a major disruption to life as many knew emerged and “shut down” our world. We experienced first-hand that our systems and infrastructures of trade, travel, and commerce are fragile and just how interconnected and interdependent we are with the rest of the world.

Several times over the past year, my family experienced the death of our relatives because of the damage COVID-19 does to the body’s organs and functions and we could not be with them in their final moments. Sadly, too many families experienced loss in this way. Still, others suffer the effects from the supply chain breaks, infrastructure inadequacies like the deadly cold snap in Texas, and the injury that results from long-term isolation.

Our Lenten journey invites us to recognize and meet the frustrations and loss that accompanies this pandemic. Our journey invites us to acknowledge and hold up the rage, death, and disbelief surrounding the violent uprising against our U.S. Government with a period of self-examination. This season of Lent is a period when, if no other time in the year, we can assess our actions, our words, and our values for alignment with the way of Jesus.

Our Lenten devotional series invites us to examine our habits and determine if they bring us closer to God. How do our habits demonstrate compassion, curiosity, and forgiveness toward people with different world views and experiences than our own? The series walks us through daily acts of

reading scripture, prayer, and choosing to do something that starts a healthy habit.

Jesus said that those who follow Him, His disciples are to do as He does. (John 13:14) This is how we too can adopt healthy habits that care for one another and speak love in the face of hatred, abuse, and devastation. People still need hope. Just as Jesus was the initiator of reconciling humanity to God, you are being called to be real hope as God's ambassadors.

In Jesus' atoning for our sins, by His love for us, and our acceptance of Jesus as Savior, we are reconciled with God. By His Spirit, Jesus has charged us with the ministry of reconciliation. We are to be reconcilers, just as Jesus did for us. People need you and me to invite them to remember God's love for us and that we too are to love, repent, and forgive one another, for God first loved us. My prayer is that we each can accept Jesus as our Savior, and His ways. He is our reason for hope and our model for how to live in the world as ambassadors of peace and reconciliation. May this period of reflection and remembrance of God's love for us be the air that helps to sustain us through this pandemic and empower us to act with kindness, grace, and the joy of the Gospel in the name of Jesus.

TREASURER’S REPORT

The cash receipt and expenditures activity for the period January 1 thru January 31, 2021. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelop. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e. salaries, utilities, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is referring to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the sanctuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card Program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaining a Giant Gift Card. The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our financial commitments. Just a quick statement informing everyone that we were successful in modifying our current mortgage loan. The new monthly payment is \$1,031.90 beginning March 10, 2021. We are very appreciative of BB&T to accomplish for us without occurring any additional costs for the modification to Dryland.

These are times that we can feel insecure. Psalm 37 and Psalm 73 can provide support to overcome those feelings. When feeling insecure, we need to do:

1. Decide to Trust in the Lord
2. Trust in the Lord then do good
3. Dwell in the faithfulness of the Lord
4. Delight yourself in the Lord
5. Dedicate your life to the Lord
6. Download your worries to the Lord
7. Discipline yourself to wait on the Lord

Do Not forget the to use the daily devotional that Pastor Ed provided for us during this Lenten Season. With Your Whole Heart, a family devotions & activities for Lent, we can prepare for our Lord’s crucifixion and resurrection together.

We Appreciate and Thank each of you for your generosity no matter the size to assure the church remains part of the community and part of your life. There is plenty of work to accomplish, so don’t feel bashful to pitch in.

Dear friends, the consistory at Dryland UCC has decided that we will be having what we are calling a “soft” opening. At our traditional 10:15 worship time on February 28, 2021 we will open the sanctuary to view the prerecorded worship service on the screens in the front of the church. This is NOT a live church service. The Dryland consistory with the guidance of Pastor Livingston is trying to balance the safety of the congregation and church employees. We are aware that many of us feel that the experience of worship is enhanced by our presence in the sanctuary for a time of peace and reflection. We are also aware that many do not feel safe returning to indoor gatherings in the company of others outside our family groups at this time. We are respectful and understanding of the different levels of comfort each of you may feel about gathering inside at this point. We want to offer an opportunity for those who feel the in-person worship experience is an essential part of your Christian spiritual journey to have an option to fulfill that need. There are still significant risks associated with in person gatherings and if you elect to attend you will be accepting that reality in the world in which we now live. If you decide you would like to attend in person viewing of the prerecorded service in the sanctuary we request you call the church office @ (610)759-4444 or email the church drylandoffice@rcn.com to let us know you will be attending. This is not a requirement. We would just like a general idea ahead of time how many may be interested so we can make appropriate safety accommodations. We will be keeping a list of those who attend in the event we will need to assist in contact tracing. Temperatures will be taken prior to entering the sanctuary. Masks or face shields will be worn at all times

when inside the building. You may sit with others who live in the same household as you, but a 6' minimum social distance will be observed for the safety of all others. We realize that this is not an ideal answer to everyone's expectations about how it is appropriate to worship at this time. Some would return to full inside worship tomorrow while others may not feel comfortable for some time yet. As Christians we remain respectful of others and their choices at this time. We love you and welcome all of you to this in person worship opportunity. We also fully support anyone's decision to continue to utilize the online options which will continue to be offered for the foreseeable future. Respectfully yours, The Dryland UCC Consistory



Consistory is looking for more (and also different) volunteers to help Rich and Karen in the kitchen. We are asking that someone “step up” to be in charge of assigning these volunteers for the kitchen on a regular basis. Currently the kitchen is preparing 2 meals per month for sale to the public. It would involve receiving the time & date that volunteers are needed from Rich, email them to the congregation, plug in the volunteer names (from returned responses - via a call or email) and then give that information to Rich so he will know when and from whom he can expect help. If you are interested in helping out with this task, please let a consistory member know ASAP.

In speaking with Rich, we have heard the frustration of having the same people doing all the work all the time. They have been shouldering this responsibility for months (even years) and we, the consistory, feel the need for fresh help to relieve this concern. Our congregation needs to be more aware of their contributions and dedication to Dryland. I can only imagine where we would be without their sacrifice and help each month. We need to not take them for granted and be appreciative of their many years of dedication and hard work. Many of us know the pressure this pandemic has put on us all physically, mentally and financially – and the church is no different.

Rich & Karen spend probably 25-30 hours of their own time working in the kitchen in preparation for

EACH meal. These meals and their monetary return have become a huge part of insuring that we can financially meet the monthly needs of our current fund to keep Dryland UCC operational. When the church was open, these meal profits were previously used for special needs and projects in the church. With COVID and the church being closed, combined with less week to week giving, Dryland has needed these funds to remain operational. We are asking that you prayerfully consider giving of your time to help Dryland. Even if you are unable to volunteer, participation by purchasing a meal is greatly appreciated.

Below is listed the volunteer needs for the coming week. It is important to mention, that of the times listed, volunteers can give any amount of time they can – even if it is for just one hour. They need not commit to the entire time that is listed. It needs to be emphasized too, that all necessary precautions, regarding COVID recommendations, are being followed.

Our next meal is the February 20th. Volunteers are needed for the following dates & time frames:

Wednesday Feb. 17th: 10 Am to 3 PM – 1 person for baking and 2 people for general kitchen help

Friday Feb. 19th: 10 AM to 4 PM - 3 people for general kitchen help

Saturday Feb 20th: 9 AM to 2 PM - 1 person for general kitchen help 11:30-2 PM 3 people as runners to deliver meals from the building to the cars
