God is gracious and is guiding our church family through a particularly difficult time. The past year has called for unprecedented considerations and adaptations for churches far and near. As you are well aware, Dryland has lost loved ones and learned to meet, mourn, and celebrate life in different ways. We have had to adapt in many of the core ways that we gather and share as the church.

Caring for the wellbeing of the community, we committed to a period of worship services that were only virtual and made available on our website. We further adapted by hosting worship service in-person outdoors, whenever possible, to help reduce the risk of spreading

the virus and maintained the availability of online live worship services for those not able to attend in-person. In addition, we instituted precautions in the church facilities to reduce risks as we returned to gathering for in-person worship. We have observed the changes in worship participation and attendance and moved to hold one Christmas Eve Worship Service at 7 PM for 2021. This service will include both Communion and selections by the choir and bell choir.

The transitions and limitations resulting from COVID safety precautions have not been easy on our community. Low spirits from extended periods of isolation and restrictions are evident, with more moments of impatience and quick tempers. 'COVID Fatigue' is impacting us in a variety of ways. We are making every effort to continue serving our community with joy despite the changes forced upon us by the pandemic. The 9:30 AM start of Sunday worship — historically reserved for summertime — was continued into the fall of 2021 to nurture a united fellowship for existing and exploring members.

Continuing with one combined worship service can further unify our worshipping community through a shared experience of celebrating together as Christ's church. This also promotes learning God's commands to love God and one another as ourselves in a supportive way during this time of 'Great Disruption.' I pray that these efforts, along with your continued prayers and participation, will allow Dryland to continue as a beacon of light, a city on a hill to the glory of God. I pray that you will extend grace and continue to support your leadership in these difficult decisions.

I pray that you will continue to support the mission of this Church of Christ to go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that Jesus commanded us. (Matthew 28:19-20) I pray that together, we will be steadfast in our refreshed ways of gathering as people of God. Thank you for persevering. Thank you for your prayers. Thank you for stepping up in ways that none would have imagined necessary. Thank you for striving to keep Christ at the center of all we do and speak. May your time of Thanksgiving and the start of the Advent Season - the time we anticipate the arrival of Jesus, God's Joy to the world – be healthy, hope filled, and happy.

This allows for greater flexibility in your giving decision.

On-line giving has proven to be of great benefit to the finance committee in providing regular and expected revenue in covering the regular monthly expenses of the church.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The cash receipt and expenditures activity for the period October 1 thru October 31, 2021. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelop. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e. salaries, utilities, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is referring to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the sanctuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card Program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaining a Giant Gift Card. The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our financial commitments. For the year

(January 1 thru September 30), we are at 67% monthly average of meeting our required monthly budget receipts. Ideally, we should be at a 100% or greater number of receiving monthly budget receipts. If you have not participated in supporting this goal, please prayerfully consider how that may change so we can end 2021 in a positive direction.

We pray everyone had memorable moments giving thanks for family, friends, and great food during the Thanksgiving Holiday. Through the Grace and power of our mighty God, these events are provided. Now we enter the Advent Season preparing to receive the birth of Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is our prayer that everyone takes a moment to reflect on the true meaning of the season. Maybe it will help us, even for a moment, to stop thinking of the current events in our world that causes much anxiety, lack of trust, and uneasiness toward our fellow human beings. Let us instead change our thoughts to focus on the calmness, truth, and fellowship provide by the Word of our Lord.
