Grace and peace Beloved of God,

With each passing day of this new year, there is a little more time for the sun to shine across the land and a little more daylight to help another during the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is when we remember that Jesus entered the world to walk among us as the new dawn, the light of the world, and the Son of God. Thanks be to God for coming to the world as Jesus the Christ, the joy of our salvation!

Jesus gathered for worship with the congregation at Nazareth when He declared, <sup>18</sup>"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, <sup>19</sup>to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Luke 4:18-19) We have reason to rejoice as the year of the Lord's favor is not a point in time that has passed or a future time that people must wait for. The year of the Lord's favor was ushered in with the birth of Jesus, Emmanuel, God with us. As people of faith, we can live in the assurance that Jesus the Christ is the cornerstone of our belief in Him as our Savior and Redeemer.

Now, more than ever in our lifetime, people need to see, hear, and experience the hope of our Savior. This is one of the most troubling times for people of every generation and location. We have in Jesus the essential truths that believing in Him is the first step in our transformation and the renewal of our minds. What this world needs, what the people of this world need, is to know Love for themselves. God is love! Love unites, renews, and reconciles us to see, speak, listen, and treat one another with compassion. Love strengthens us to seek God first and to turn our worries over to our Creator God. Fears and doubts are natural responses that we

experience as humans. However, take a moment to consider this thought from the Reverend Mark Batterson, that doubt has a way of putting our circumstances between us and God. When we focus more on our circumstances than on God, who has such tremendous love for us, we allow space for our circumstances to distance us from trusting in God and living in the assurance that God is always with us.

On the other hand, if we confess our limitations and accept that "faith is putting God between us and our circumstances," we can be free to step forward with the assurance of God's promise to never leave us nor forsake us. This calls to mind a faith lesson I appreciate from the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He once said, "Faith is taking the first step when you can't see the whole staircase." Rev. King understood the power that faith in God brings, and inspired generations of people to place God between us and our circumstances. Many across the globe and right here at home have been able to overcome the tyranny of racial hatred and religious bigotry.

I hope we are able to place God between us and our circumstances to the glory of God and restoration of community. Be encouraged, God is with us. Bless someone during this season of Epiphany. Carry out acts of kindness that meet or exceed the needs of a stranger or friend. Share words of encouragement with another person that through your words and deeds, others may come to know God's love. Be a beacon of Christ's light that reminds others that they are deeply loved by God.

### **NEWS FROM DRYLAND HISTORIAN** **“DRYLAND UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST”**

The early records of the Church of the Drylands are not as clear as we would like them to be. From what can be determined the first church built was the Union Church beginning in 1763. The church had two

denominations “Reformed” and “Lutheran”. The church was known as the “Dryland Lutheran & Reformed Church”. The reformed group was incorporated in 1853 and the Lutheran which was then known as Trinity Lutheran was incorporated in 1907. So, you had two denominations having services out of one church building together, sharing expenses etc. On March 1, 1965, articles of dissolution were signed and the union of these two denominations were dissolved. On May 15, 1966, Dryland United Church of Christ broke ground at Newburg, PA, the current site of Dryland UCC. On October 9, 1966, the corner stone was laid. On February 26, 1967, Trinity Lutheran and Dryland UCC held a final service together. On March 1, 1967, the UCC of the Drylands moved to their new building to hold a Lenten Service. The above History of the two churches were very complex and goes back a good 250 years. The record keeping of both denominations, the Reformed side and the Lutheran side started out keeping joint records and somewhere along the line separated. This separation date is not known.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

The cash receipt and expenditures activity for the period December 1 thru December 31, 2021. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelop. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e. salaries, utilities, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is referring to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the sanctuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card Program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaining a Giant Gift Card.

The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our financial commitments.

For 2021 the Current-Mission-Property Category had a deficient of \$43,899.54. We were able to offset that loss with the diligent efforts of the kitchen committee profits and transferring money from the Memorial account. We prayerfully hope that the congregation contributions for 2022 can meet our monthly operational costs in this category. Our planning goals for future projects (material and spiritual) can be met from the efforts of the kitchen committee and Memorial account. For 2022 the leadership is changing our focus a bit. We realize the importance of keeping a strong balance sheet to meet operational requirements. However, the last 2 months of 2021 have shown a much more significant insight of what the church is. The outreach to help others and the spirit of giving for the work of the Lord is gratifying. Borrowing a commercial slogan – You must Refresh to be Fresh! Keeping that in mind, we will try to be encouraging to each other and improve in our ability to assist those in need. To present financial information for 2022, we will not wait for month end to present information in the newsletter. We will submit what we have at the time the newsletter article is due. Hopefully this will give you a more current snapshot instead of a two-month lookback. So, for this year so far:

For January 1 thru January 22,2022 (Church Envelope Categories) we received:
