

Blessings from consistory! We hope this newsletter finds everyone happy and welcoming to this much warmer spring weather. I am sorry to have to begin with the announcement that we no longer have Heidi Singer as our president. She has resigned and she and Allen (her husband) no longer attend Dryland UCC. We would like to thank her and Allen for their strong leadership and dedicated commitment to making Dryland United Church of Christ "A Place to Belong".

As a result of Heidi's leaving, we are in need of people to serve on consistory. We also do not have a current president and unfortunately, prior to her departure, we were several people short of having enough to serve on the consistory. If anyone is interested in serving on consistory in any capacity, please contact Jerry Hittinger, Dan Cruttenden or the church office. We would be very grateful for your time, talent, and service.

At the beginning of the month, we conducted a special congregational meeting. At this meeting the situation regarding our parking lot repairs were presented to the congregation. After the informational presentation by Dewayne Heller and some discussion, the congregation approved the bid and renovations needed to preserve the parking lot. The total cost was in the \$14,000 range to seal cracks, re-seal the entire lot and repaint the

parking spots and directional arrows. At this time donations have been outstanding. We need roughly less than \$3000 to cover that entire cost. We cannot thank our congregation enough for their generosity, support and loyalty in this cause.

The consistory continues to work diligently on ways that we can maintain our sustainability for the future. Without that sustainability solution, there is a danger that in less than 2 years we may possibly have to close our doors. The financial committee is also working very hard to find ways to cut costs in the budget to keep our church moving forward.

As for future activities within the church, many things have been planned at this point. Such events as a paint party, movie night, a Red Cross blood drive, bingo, and kitchen meals. The kitchen crew works very hard to help keep Dryland in a good place, both financially and with service to the community. We cannot thank Karen and Rich (including their dedicated workers) enough for the time they have put into this service.

There is a need for bakers for both birthday Sunday and the election day bake sale. If you are able to bake or help with either of those events, please contact the office ASAP. Election day (April 23rd) bake goods can be dropped off at the church the day before the election.
