Each day that we draw breath, we are filled with potential. That potential may vary from moment to moment, but in most cases, each moment comes with power and choice. The season of Epiphany celebrates the power and decision that God chose to enter our finite time and space so that humanity may be redeemed and reconciled with God. This is partly why so many remember and rejoice with the great revealing, the epiphany of our God in the person of Jesus.

We recognize the start of the Lenten season during February. This is a 40-day period from Ash Wednesday to Easter/Resurrection Sunday. This time provides a practical opportunity for each of us to reflect on the work of Jesus, His call for each of us, and what He is calling us to become as His church.

I invite you to journey together as a congregation and focus on hearing what God is saying and heeding what God is calling you to do, and to become. I invite you to draw encouragement each day in remembrance that God so loved humankind that He not only came and lived among us, but He sacrificed Himself on the cross to atone for our sins. Through such a sacrifice, Christ Jesus made the way for us to be reconciled with God. May His love for you draw you closer in your journey with God and allow you to use your gifts to further the mission of His Church.

Dryland Church gathers as followers of Jesus. We serve as His disciples. Drawing closer to God is important now, more than ever. We have endured some particularly difficult times as a church. The Pandemic was a period of great disruption. The norms of youth and adults were impacted. Most areas of life, including church fellowship, were placed on hold. Most everyone knows someone whose family experienced the loss of loved ones. In the wake of grief and disrupted norms, an absence of intergenerational fellowship is one of the areas we ache as a body. Our Holy Texts describe the assembly of followers as the body of Christ. This biblical view has many applications. Concerning our relationships with Christ and one another, consider the text of 1 Corinthians 12. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit, we were all baptized into one body, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit (Verses 12 and 13).

God has grafted us together as one body so that we also may care for one another, grieve with each who suffers loss, and celebrate with each who experiences joy. God knows our grief, loss, and fear. God also promises to be with us always and desires that we all become one in Christ Jesus (John 17:21). Unity in the Spirit is essential for our body of Christ to feel whole and to impact our community as an intergenerational body.

Know that God is present for each of us and can deliver us. Deliverance is liberation, release, or relief by Christ from burdens too heavy to bear and things that separate us from God. Whether we are feeling indifference, uncertainty, or rage, waiting on God can bring about our deliverance. God calls us to rest and abide with God so that we can hear God's instructions for renewal, forgiveness, and growth.

As we journey through this Lenten season, let us recommit to discovering the unique way God is calling Dryland to minister and impact through missions. Keep looking for strength through Christ and trust that each of us will become the disciple God is forming us to be. Be encouraged. Believe in God's promises and together we will realize the potential that God sees in each of us, as the body of Christ.


Here are some of the needed items:


