Grace and Peace Beloved of God.

The Season of Lent provides an intentional time for looking within to hear in fresh ways the sacred instructions to love God and to love your neighbor as yourself. (Mark 12:30-31) To love the Lord your God, you must first know God. God desires that we transform our minds so that our hearts may be informed and prepared to love. This transformation starts with knowledge in the head, moves to experience within the heart, and flows outward to impact the world around us with action.

The impact followers of Jesus are to have on the world is that of truth that the Lord God is good, His mercies are new each day, and His grace is sufficient to enjoy new life, know peace now, and spend eternity with Him in heaven. This is the gift for those who choose to follow the way of Jesus. As followers of Jesus, we are to spread this knowledge and serve as bridge builders in a world that is strained with many fractures.

The world needs the peace of Christ. The Lenten Season offers a fixed time in the years to share in a time of reflection and remembrance of Jesus and his vision of nonviolent revolution for the sake of saving the souls of humankind. The revolution is that the Messiah came not to conquer by might, but to overwhelm the forces of evil and violence with love.

During this period, I am reminded of an instruction Jesus shared for the disciples and all people would follow Him to do. Jesus makes the command to take up your cross and follow Him. Understand that taking up your cross means choosing Jesus and choosing to walk in the instruction that Jesus provides. Instead of calling on God to stamp out the enemy, we are to call upon God for strength to seek reconciliation, strength to forgive, and strength to lay down instruments of violence, including the harm that can come from what we say.

In the Gospel text of Mark, chapter 8, Jesus teaches why following Christ as His disciple is essential for your soul, body, and mind now and for eternity. One declaration is the warning that striving to please the world and being measured by its standards will cause you to lose your life, your joy, and yourself; distract you from resting in God's love and instruction. What will it profit us to gain the world and its status and forfeit our life with the Divine source, God our maker? (Verses 34-36)

Only by abiding in Christ will we know God and therefore know peace, our purpose, and assurance that comes from knowing God's plan for our lives. Jesus urges that we follow Him, that is, choose His way and adopt prayer, giving, and fasting. These are the path that leads to abundant life with Christ. Prayer, giving, and fasting are guideposts and reminders that Christ is with us always. This Lenten season, search inward and share why Jesus and the Good News of the Gospel matter. Share with friend and stranger what Jesus means in your life.

# Special MEETING Parking Lot Info

On Sunday March 10<sup>th</sup> after 9:30 worship we will have a Congregational meeting for the purpose of discussing and approving work to be done on the parking lot.

In our annual meeting those present were informed of the need to attend to the parking lot. We have received a quote to have the necessary work completed which includes filling the cracks, sealing, and repainting the parking slots and directional arrows for traffic flow. The cost will be between \$13,000.00 and \$14,000.00. This need is urgent. If the parking lot continues to deteriorate to the point that it needs repaving, the cost will be multiplied by 10.

Currently we have donations earmarked for this project that get us off to a good start, covering a little over 1/3 of the cost. The best-case scenario is to commit to the work being done as soon as possible so that the job will be able to be completed during the summer months.

Keeping you informed... Discussion at our annual meeting regarding the four categories listed on the weekly envelopes. Can you explain what the funds are used for? A brief explanation follows:

Category – <u>Church Exp</u>: Funds are applied to meet our operating financial obligations for Dryland. That ranges from utilities, salaries, inside maintenance, outside maintenance, insurance, etc.

Category – <u>Missions:</u> That is our OCWM (Our Churches Wider Mission) commitment to the United Church of Christ denomination. Funds are sent to PNEC (Penn Northeast Conference, in Palmerton, PA.) to which we belong, to meet their budget requirements. They also have a commitment to General Synod. A portion of the money is also forward to the UCC General Synod as determined in the conference budget. Both conference and General synod can apply funds to mission projects that are determined by them. When Dryland has a mission project we want to support, we issue a separate communication for that project. NONE of our project money is sent to

conference under the OCWM umbrella. It is clearly earmarked for that mission project. For example: NIN (Neighbors In Need) all funds go to that project.

Category – <u>Property</u>: Funds are used to maintain inside & outside property. This fund supplements the Church Exp category. Category – <u>Capital</u>: Fund is used to pay down the \$300,000.00 loan we signed in 2009. The loan was for the front lawn sign, parking lot (repair, seal, & Line), sanctuary renovation (pew restoration, new carpeting, all new lighting, new lighting controls, new audio system, new video system, control area for audio video equipment and operation, altar area enhancement).

I know this is a reader's digest version, so please feel free to ask any questions for clarification or suggestions. It is our intent to keep you informed and not confused.

We Appreciate and Thank each of you for your generosity no matter the size to assure the church remains part of the community and part of your life. There is plenty of work to accomplish, so do not feel bashful to pitch in. We do so by **Faith** and **LOVE** for one another!
